On May 5th, Siwoo (Y3) and Sia (Y2) took part in the Tolworth Gymnastics Competition, each competing in a different level.


Siwoo won 1st place in the Pink Level, and Sia achieved 2nd place in the Blue Level.




Last weekend Imogen (Y4) made lemonade and cookies all by herself. She set up a stall outside her house and raised £26 for school!



This week in St Elizabeth Class (Year 2)




We have been doing some excellent learning in St Elizabeth class this week. In English, we have been writing a warning tale where we have been working really hard on using similes. Here are some examples we came up with:
