How to help at home

- Continue to read at home as much as possible, encouraging your child to join in with familiar stories to develop expression. When you read with your child at home, please make a note in their reading diary to show you have read together.
- On Monday morning, the children will complete writing about their weekend. Over the weekend or on the way to school, please speak to your child about their weekend to give them an idea to write about. Children could also come in with an object to spark interest relating to somewhere you may have been to visit or an activity you completed over the weekend.
- Encourage your child to write independently and use the sound mats to form letters correctly – these have been sent out and can be found on Google Classroom.
- Develop fine motor skills to use tools, a knife, and fork for cutting food, scissors to cut out a shape, pencil control, and other mark-making resources such as painting with a fine brush.
- Over the summer term we will be working with the children to support them to make the transition to year one. We will visit the big playground, have some of our lessons in the year one classrooms and eventually introduce the children to their new teacher. Please support your child at home by encouraging independence with coats, looking after their property, using cutlery, and speaking in full sentences when they are responding to an adult. For example when asking for lunch “Please may I have a jacket potato?”
- Over the summer term, please check Google Classroom each Friday for a homework task.
- As we come into the Summer term, children must bring a named water bottle into school with plain, still water, apply sun lotion and provide a cap to wear.
